How to Get Here

Nestled in the geographic heart of NSW, the Lachlan region lies to the west of Forbes and Parkes. It's bordered by key routes including the Newell Highway (A39), which runs from Queensland to Victoria, the Kidman Way (B87), a popular western route through outback NSW, and the Mid Western Highway (B64) to the south. Venture off these well-travelled roads and you'll discover the Lachlan Shire — a destination full of unforgettable experiences!

The stunning Lachlan Shire Visitor Information Centre is located alongside the world-famous Utes in the Paddock sculpture park. It includes interactive displays, maps, guides and a cafe, and is the ideal place to plan your stay in the Lachlan.

How's the Weather?

The Lachlan region enjoys warm summers and mild winters with around 430mm of rainfall each year. Temperatures can range between daytime highs of 15°C in winter to 33°C in the summer. It's not unusual to hit the mid to high 40°s. However, the outback can get cool at night in winter, with frosts possible from May to August.









Off the GRID

The beauty of escaping to somewhere that is truly 'away from it all' is that it gives you legitimate permission to have your very own 'digital detox'.

Here in the Lachlan, we politely ask you to switch off your devices. No, it's not because they might disrupt flight navigation or interrupt fellow moviegoers. We just think it's nice to experience this part of the world like it has been experienced for 60,000 years. Replacing the pings and rings of modern life with the spectacular sounds of nature.

Unlock and Unplug

Towns and Villages


Dotted across our map you'll find a handful of towns and villages. Some reveal busy centres and wide streets, while others are small close-knit communities brought together by a shared history. But whatever the size, each has a unique personality and a story to tell. Get to know each of them here...

To describe this small town in one word would, ironically be "big" – as in the big wide spaces in all directions that have long played muse for many poets, authors and artists over the years.

Then of course there are the big things you might spot in town. It's easy to see why it's called the Rabbit Trap Hotel, with a giant version of its namesake trap resting on the establishment's roof and historic trapper's hut nearby. And just across the road, you simply cannot miss the 'Big Beer Can' – another giant selfie magnet.

But arguably bigger than even these are the big smiles and personalities you'll meet in town – a community built on grains and happily fuelled by it too (just add hops, yeast and water!). So be sure to stop in for a cold beer and a 'big' story or two!

BURCHER

With its grain silos, there is no mistaking the wheat belt that the town of Burcher sits amongst. As further proof, a windmill structure sits in the centre of town – an iconic symbol of the outback, but also less known as a practical water pump. Although a more reliable waterhole today can be found at the Burcher Hotel.

At the western end of town, you'll find the Bush Chapel – fully consecrated and providing a uniquely open-air chapel to worship amongst nature. You can also explore nearby Manna Mountain – a place of special significance to the Wiradjuri. Hike to the stone grooves to see evidence of many centuries of use by tribes sharpening their blades on the rock.

Of course, it's not just wheat in these parts. Drive 20 minutes south to Lake Cowal – NSW's largest inland lake and home to a 325m deep open pit gold mine project on its shores.



CONDOBOLIN

"Condo" – a laid-back, riverside town of around 3,500 people that sits in a desirable Goldilocks sweet-spot of 'not too big, not too small'.

Built along the gentle bends of the Lachlan River, Condobolin is the main commercial centre for the region – with a bustling array of shops and eateries on hand to service the surrounding farming communities. But that doesn't mean all work and no play.

On the contrary, it's a great place to experience the great outdoors – from camping and fishing to golfing, swimming, or enjoying watersports at nearby Gum Bend Lake. Art and culture are on full display too, with a number of museums, crafts, shops and the impressive Wiradjuri Study Centre – the latter, providing unique insights into First Nations history, as well as artworks and language teaching opportunities.

Condo is also where you'll find the famous Utes in the Paddock sculpture park and the impressive visitor information centre. It is the gateway to Sculpture Down the Lachlan public art trail, spanning 100km along the Lachlan Valley Way to meet the Newell Highway at Forbes - just a hint to the unique creativity of this region.

The railway reached Condobolin in 1898 and consequently, the town became the railhead for the central west until 1927 when the line to Broken Hill was completed.

DERRIWONG

As you drive west along Henry Parkes Way from its namesake town of Parkes, you'll share the journey with the Sydney to Broken Hill railway line – with many small towns dotted along the way.

Approximately 20km shy of Condobolin, one such town is Derriwong – with one translation of its name being "place of the grey magpie". And you'll certainly swoop right through this tiny rural settlement today – existing purely for its agricultural surrounds and relying on Condobolin for services. Sitting in the floodplain of the Lachlan River and adjacent Goobang Creek, its low-rise skyline is broken only by its towering railside grain silo – an easy reminder of the history of this land.

FIFIELD

Like so many of the Lachlan's charming small towns, Fifield gathers its community together around its hotel – an attractive federation-style establishment with a large upstairs balcony. This focal point is a great place to enjoy a drink, a game of pool or darts, while the neighbouring community hall and park across the road hint at its role as a hub for the surrounding farms.

However, it wasn't always sheep, cattle and crops around here. Fifield was actually once Australia's largest platinum producer – with large deposits (along with gold) first discovered here in the 1880s. Around 20,000 ounces (650kg) of alluvial platinum was removed from the surrounding land – a fascinating shiny insight into a faded past.






LAKE (ARGELLIGO

Sitting alongside its namesake body of water and approximately 100km west of Condobolin, this inland oasis got its name from a variation of 'Cudjallagong' – which means 'lake' or 'water container' in the Wiradjuri language.

The lake's naturally abundant food sources saw Wiradjuri tribes gather here often over the centuries. Large shell middens can still be found at Deadman's Point, while the shores at Frog's Hollow is a site of ochre pits – rich red and yellow deposits once used for face painting and artworks.

The town itself started life as a camp for sawyers cutting forests of cypress pine. But that changed when gold was discovered in 1873, causing a rush for many decades. Today, "Lake" is a major haven for birdwatchers – with hundreds of species (and photographers!) flocking to the water's edge all year round. A 2022-painted mural on the old water tower showcases this birdlife and the towns iconic history.


Lake is also a popular spot for fishing, boating and water skiing, with a scenic waterfront walkway. In recent years, a thriving industrial precinct has also emerged – creating many innovative products for Australia and the world!


MURRIN BRIDGE

This small Aboriginal community provides an important link to the region's past. As the region grew into the 20th century, expansion of farms and the colonisation of the area saw many Indigenous people displaced. Initially, they gathered at a water source known as Carowra Tank until 1934, when conflicting tribes were relocated to a station named Menindee.

Following World War II, a more suitable spot was secured – with the establishment of Murrin Bridge Aboriginal Station in 1949. Today, this tiny locality sits on the north side of the Lachlan River, just 12km from Lake Cargelligo – which is where residents access services, including initiatives like 'Down the Track' – aiming to improve opportunities for young people in remote areas.







DID YOU KNOW?

Tottenham was first recognised as the geographical centre of New South Wales during the opening of the Sydney Harbour Bridge in 1932.

TULLIBIGEAL

Situated on the rail line from West Wyalong to Lake Cargelligo, Tullibigeal (an Aboriginal word for "wooden spears") is delightfully off the beaten track, even by the Lachlan's standards! Made up of a small grid of streets, this proud wheat and sheep farming community is a testament to the endurance of its people.

Settled at the end of the First World War, "Tulli" made use of fertile land and continues to service the surrounding farms to this day. Things move at a relaxed pace in these parts, with visitors welcome to take their time as they enjoy free camping and facilities in the park, browse through the Co-op or enjoy a cheeky beverage at the Mayfield Hotel.

While you're in town, take a trip back in time and discover how the local women once operated the historic fire truck, which now stands proudly in the heart of the town.

TOTTENHAM

Located in the north of the Lachlan region, Tottenham's claim to fame centres on being the geographic centre of NSW – with a rock cairn marking the spot some 30 minutes out of town. However, the town itself offers plenty for the visitor, anchored by the delightfully restored 1931 Tottenham Hotel.

A visit to the local visitor information centre will reveal souvenirs, local arts and crafts and further surprises about this small country town – including a walking trail of more than 20 historic sites. There's plenty of art to be found, from colourful mosaics to the 2023-painted water tower – adorned with a mural of cockatoos, a goanna, native flora and fauna, and historic stories.

In summer, the swimming pool turns into the social hub of the town - so take a dip - what better way to meet the locals!

Speaking of birds, don't forget to take your binoculars and camera as you will experience some spectacular birdwatching opportunities.





What's On



UNLYCK WIRADJURI Country

We are proud to be a part of the largest Indigenous Nation in NSW. The Wiradjuri people have a connection to the land that goes back 60,000 years – making them one of the oldest civilisations on Earth.

Wiradjuri means the land of three rivers: the Womboy (Macquarie), Gulari (Lachlan) and Murrumbidgee.

- For centuries, Wiradjuri people have lived in harmony with the natural world. Through 'Dreaming', they see Baiame as creator and sky father. They follow the ways in how to treat the land, animals and each other, through connections with Mother Earth and Father Sky.
- The fertile floodplains and wetlands of the Lachlan River (Wiradjuri: Gulari) provided a rich source of food, while the plains yielded native grass seeds, plus kangaroo and emu.
- Wiradjuri people traditionally travelled seasonally in groups of around 10 to 50, with each group defined by a spiritual totem. Education, art and craft continue to be extremely important.

Today, Wiradjuri culture remains strong and visible throughout the Lachlan Shire. We recommend visiting:

- The Wiradjuri Study Centre in Condobolin, a hub for learning and cultural exchange, where you can delve into the history and traditions.
- The Grinding Grooves at Manna Mountain near Burcher, where ancient stone markings offer a glimpse into the practices and rituals of the past.
- King's Grave (Goobothery Hill) is a scared burial site of an Aboriginal Chief.
- Aboriginal freshwater middens and ochre pits at Lake Cargelligo, evidence of the Wiradjuri people's deep connection to the land and their long-standing cultural practices.
- The Reconciliation Mural at Fisho's Hot Bake and Takeaway in Lake Cargelligo, an inspiring artwork that beautifully represents the ongoing journey of reconciliation between the Wiradjuri people and the broader community.



THE WIRADJURI STUDY CENTRE

Embark on a journey to the Wiradjuri Study Centre and immerse yourself in the living culture of one of Australia's oldest and most vibrant Indigenous communities.

The Centre is a powerful reflection of the strength, resilience, and deep-rooted heritage of the Wiradjuri people. Founded with a vision to share and preserve Wiradjuri knowledge, it has grown into a lively centre for cultural learning, celebration, and community connection.

Visitors are welcomed into a space where stories are shared, traditions are honoured, and the spirit of the Wiradjuri continues to thrive.

The Lachlan region's great outdoors provide the perfect setting to unlock a range of outdoor activities – from the peaceful to the fast-paced, on water or dry land. We invite you to experience it all right here in 'our backyard'!

Walking and Biking Trails

There's nothing quite like slowing the pace and breathing in the fresh air on foot or by bike! In Lake Cargelligo, the scenic foreshore walkway is perfect for a relaxed morning stroll or bike ride, with views across the water and linking key spots around town.

Over in Condobolin, wander along the leafy riverbanks, through peaceful reserves, or head up Reservoir Hill for a sweeping view across the town and surrounding farmland. For a longer route, the Gum Bend Lake trail is an easy track for walking, jogging, or cycling.

For those craving a challenge, Mount Tilga, 8km north of Condobolin offers a rewarding climb! The mountain rises 456m and rewards hikers with stunning 360-degree views over the Lachlan Valley and the Central Western plains—well worth the effort!

Just outside the village of Burcher, follow the walking tracks to Manna Mountain—a place of deep cultural and spiritual significance.

Whether you're after a peaceful wander or a scenic adventure, Lachlan Shire delivers fresh air and unforgettable views at every turn.

Motorbike and Car

There is no greater sense of freedom than touring throughout the Lachlan region with your own vehicle. There are many free camping options available, as well as a number of holiday parks, B&B's, hotels and motels to allow you to rest and reset in comfort. The roads are well maintained, although not all are sealed – including the road following the river from Condobolin towards Lake Cargelligo. If travelling after rain events, give the Visitor Information Centres a call to check road conditions.

Heritage Walks

In addition to the picturesque walking trails, we invite you to explore the rich history of the region. In Condobolin, the historic courthouse stands as a prominent landmark, offering a glimpse into the town's storied past. Lake Cargelligo's Railway Heritage Walk is a must-do, featuring the well-preserved train turntable—an iconic symbol of the region's railway history. In Tottenham, discover the Hudson's Shop Block, an architectural gem with deep historical significance. Tullibigeal's Mayfield Hotel provides a fascinating look at the village's heritage, while the village walks in Fifield, Burcher, and Albert highlight the unique histories and landmarks of these charming communities.



Fishing

Our inland rivers and lakes provide some of the best freshwater angling in the region. Fish are important to the region for river health and are of Indigenous cultural significance. Fishing is a wonderful way to pass the time on the Lachlan River, Lake Cargelligo or Gum Bend Lake and is popular, all year round with murray cod (Dec to Aug), silver perch, yellow belly and redfin for the taking. And if you are taking a fish or two for supper, be sure to purchase your fishing licence online before you head out!

Country Drives

Take a leisurely scenic drive and explore three 'bush trail' routes:

The Bogan Way (Condobolin to Tottenham via Fifield and Albert)

Just 42 km west of Tottenham lies the very heart of New South Wales. A commemorative cairn marks this exact geographical centre, offering travellers a unique photo opportunity and a true sense of being in the middle of it all.



DID YOU KNOW?

In the 1950s, waterskiing really took off here... with a world record for longest barefoot waterskiing set by Harold Miller at Lake Cargelligo in 1966. How long? One hour and nine seconds!

Condobolin to Lake Cargelligo (via Tullibigeal and Lake Brewster)

Take in the peaceful wetland sanctuary at Curlew Waters, it's the ideal place for spotting native and migratory birds - perfect for nature lovers and photographers alike!

Condobolin to Lake Cowal (via Burcher/Manna Mountain)

Head from Burcher to Lake Cowal, where you will find one of New South Wales' largest inland lakes—a peaceful retreat for nature lovers and adventurers alike.

For more details on these trails and other self-guided driving tours, stop by the Visitor Information Centres where the friendly team will be happy to help you plan your journey.

Sports

In the Shire, winter means footy season, with local ovals buzzing with tackles, cheers, and community pride. Both Lake Cargelligo and Condobolin are year-round sports hubs, offering AFL, rugby, netball and cricket in winter, followed by water skiing and kayaking in summer. Horse sports, including rodeos and equestrian events, also add excitement to the region's sporting calendar. Whether you're playing or cheering from the sidelines, the spirit of sport thrives.

For those seeking adventure, try clay target shooting for an outback thrill, or unwind with a round of golf. Try your hand at croquet or hit the courts for a game of social tennis. From Tottenham to Tullibigeal, Burcher to Fifield, the Lachlan's towns and villages pulse with energy, heart, and true country spirit—this is sport, Lachlan-style.

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Racing

In a quiet corner of Condobolin's tourism precinct stands the Fallen Jockeys Memorial—a simple, moving tribute to those who lost their lives in the sport they loved—horse racing.

It's more than just a monument, it's a place for reflection. Locals and visitors pause here to remember the courage of the riders and the risks they faced.

Parks and Playgrounds

The great outdoors isn't just something you admire - it's something you experience. Known for its wide-open landscapes and big skies, this region is nature's playground, with over 40 parks, reserves and playgrounds spread across its welcoming towns and villages.

Families will find plenty of space for little ones to run, explore and play. Gum Bend Lake, just outside Condobolin, is a local favourite. With a shaded playground right on the foreshore, sandy swim beach and BBQ picnic facilities, it's the ideal spot for a relaxed afternoon by the water. In the heart of Condobolin, Memorial Park offers the popular adventure playground, perfect for children of all ages. Set beside the Lachlan River and just a short stroll from the main street.

Lake Cargelligo's long and scenic foreshore is a delight for both kids and adults, with Liberty Park and play areas at Apex Park offering opportunities for fun, fresh air, and lake views. Bring a picnic, take a walk, or simply enjoy the laid-back lakeside vibe.

Smaller communities in the Shire also shine with charm and local pride. Tottenham, Albert, Fifield, Tullibigeal, and Burcher each have reserves or parks of their own - many featuring historical plaques or monuments that tell the stories of pioneering days and the people who shaped these towns. It's a chance to learn while you play.

For the older kids (and young-at-heart), skate parks in several towns offer space to shred, scoot, or simply hang out, adding another layer to the region's family-friendly appeal. So, pack the snacks, bring the sunscreen, and let the kids burn off some energy.

Swimming

No ocean? No worries. As well as the natural river and lakes to cool down, Condobolin, Lake Cargelligo, Tottenham and Tullibigeal boast great outdoor pools which are open during the warmer months (October to March).

As well as lap swimming and general splashing there are toddler pool areas, picnic and BBQ areas, shelters and food kiosks.



UNLYCK ()UR Natural Wonders

Can you hear that? It's the soundtrack of nature. The gurgle and splash of inland waterways. The flap and flutter of wings. The sunset hum of unseen insects as the sky turns a flaming orange. The sounds may be gentle, quiet almost, but the landscape and colours are big and bold.

Here, away from it all, it's very easy to feel like you've found it all – such is the raw natural beauty and sense of timelessness that reaches to the horizon and beyond. Here, in the centre of NSW, nature takes centre stage with a uniquely Australian backdrop of rivers, lakes, plains and native flora and fauna.

For thousands of years, the Wiradjuri people have cared for this natural environment so that today it can be enjoyed by locals and visitors alike.

LAKES AND RIVERS

Lachlan River

The namesake of our region, the Lachlan River is Australia's fourth longest, at more than 1,300km long. It flows through Condobolin and its meandering path feeds into Lake Cargelligo providing the perfect wetland habitat for a teeming array of birdlife. It's also a popular spot for fishing and angling, watersports, kayaking, swimming and camping along its shady banks.

Lake Cargelligo

Situated around an hour's drive west of Condobolin, Lake Cargelligo is the largest lake in the Lachlan region (8km long and 36,000 megalitres) and a paradise for more than 200 bird species. But migratory birds aren't the only ones flocking to the lake each year – with its shores attracting campers, lovers of watersports (sailing, waterskiing, kayaking), fishing enthusiasts and of course bird watchers. It shares its name with the town on its shores, a popular spot for the lovers of peace and serenity.

Gum Bend Lake

This man-made 1.8m-deep lake near Condobolin, was opened in 1988 and is a popular free camping spot with excellent amenities including showers and toilets and recreational/picnic area for visitors and locals alike. It is home to many varieties of flora and fauna – and world-class sunsets! Picnic tables, free barbecues, exercise equipment, a fenced children's playground and paved perimeter walking/cycle path (measuring just under 3km around) provides a pleasant place to unwind and enjoy the outdoors, on and off the water.

Natural Wonders

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WEIRS

Our weirs do more than just regulate river flow and provide water—they're fantastic spots for outdoor recreation!

Condobolin Weir

A scenic spot located behind the Riverview Caravan Park, Condobolin Weir is the perfect place to relax and connect with the Lachlan River's peaceful beauty.

Goobang Creek Weir

Ideal for kayakers and canoeists, Goobang Creek Weir features calm waters and breathtaking views. The sealed road access makes it easy to enjoy this serene spot.

Lake Cargelligo Weir

A birdwatcher's paradise, Lake Cargelligo Weir is home to pelicans, swans, parrots and more! Whether you're fishing, picnicking, or free camping, it's a nature lover's dream.

Booberoi Weir

For a laid-back day by the water, head to Booberoi Weir. Perfect for fishing, kayaking, or birdwatching, it offers grassy areas and plenty of shade.

Kiacatoo Weir

Nestled among gum trees and bushland, Kiacatoo Weir is a retreat for campers, fishers, and nature lovers. Its peaceful surroundings make it ideal for spotting wildlife, enjoying a quiet paddle, or setting up camp beside the gentle flow of the river.

BIRD WATCHING

The region certainly lives up to its reputation as the 'oasis of the outback' when you see the sheer numbers of birdlife that either live here year-round or migrate to our wetlands and lakes. And where there are birds, there will be bird watching – a popular and rewarding pastime for casual observers to avid enthusiasts decked out with giant camera lenses and high-powered binoculars!


Feathered Friends

If you have a list of birds to check off, this is the place – with many water/wading birds such as cormorants, spoonbill, egret, swamphens, crakes, pelicans, heron, ibis, terns, swans, ducks and geese on display plus others including cockatoos, wrens and silver gulls. There is the opportunity to glimpse a variety of rarer or threatened species including swift parrots, brolga or white-bellied sea eagle, as well as red-lored whistler or malleefowl at Lake Cargelligo's Round Hill or Nombinnie Nature Reserves.

NATURE PHOTOGRAPHY

For more than two centuries, explorers, poets, artists and now photographers have been drawn to the wide open spaces and raw natural beauty of the Australian outback landscape. The Lachlan region offers you a taste of this vast continent, while still keeping you close to a range of comforts (including extra memory cards!). The array of birdlife in particular is a key drawcard.





BIGSKY

Our sunrises and sunsets are memorable for their colour and clarity. And when night falls, the dark skies of central NSW are some of the best in Australia – proving popular with photographers and stargazers alike. The night sky is also important to the Wiradjuri people – whose Dreaming stories feature Baiame, the creator god and sky father, as well as the story of the Seven Sisters star cluster.

Art and SOUL

"H2 Oh!": Water Tower Art

Throughout small town Australia, water towers and silos have become unlikely canvases for some incredible murals. Here in the Lachlan Shire, you can now view two of the most recent additions. Lake Cargelligo's 2022 mural by Heesco Khosnaran - assisted by Erin and Damien Mitchell, depicts the township and local birdlife in stunning reds to capture the earth and sunsets (right).

Meanwhile, Tottenham's 2023 mural by Krimsone & Scott Nagy presents a colourful mix of the town's history and local flora and fauna (above). Both have added considerably to each town's skyline and are must sees.



Discover: Farm Chapel "Christ the King"

This hidden gem is located north of Tullibigeal on the farm "Bolo" between Lake Cargelligo, Kiacatoo and Condobolin and has been described as a "present for the bush".

The chapel is of a circular design, representing the form of eternity, with a bronze cross on the roof symbolising redemption through Jesus Christ.

Mrs Foster's Sculpture

Step back to 1873 in Lake Cargelligo, where Mrs. Charlotte Foster made an unexpected discovery of gold while attending to the call of nature. Her find led to the formation of Fosters Reef Gold Mining Company and the naming of Foster Street in her honour. Visit the sculpture of Mrs Foster, celebrating the discovery that shaped Lake Cargelligo's legacy.



GARAGE MURALS

Located in Tottenham, the Greig Bros Garage Murals celebrate the rich history of the area, capturing unique moments and stories.

Arty Corners

In the heart of Condobolin, a historic 1875-built hotel, now the Condobolin Community Centre, hosts exhibitions, workshops, and a shop featuring local arts and crafts.


And just wait until you discover the creative treasures waiting for you in Tottenham and Lake Cargelligo and our villages —these hidden gems are sure to inspire!

"Closing The Gap": Wiradjuri Study Centre

Any visit to Condobolin must include a tour of this stunning purpose-built centre, on McDonnell Street. Designed in a circle showcasing weaving, painting and carvings around a totem and central garden, this mudrendered structure is truly unique.

It includes an art gallery (items available for purchase), community kitchen, theatre, conference area and administration, with custom stained glass artworks and red gum pieces defining each space with messages of respect, understanding and listening.

As well as hosting schools and adult groups, the centre also holds corroborees and the bi-annual autumn 'Condo Skyfest' – a celebration of the night sky.





TES in the Paddock

"You B-'Ute"

A true celebration of outback life and the iconic Australian 'Holden ute', this colourful and unique art installation now proudly sits alongside the Lachlan Shire Visitor Information Centre in Condobolin. This brainchild of Jana and Graham Pickles was inspired by the 'Cadillac Ranch' in Texas, United States, and now the outdoor 'gallery' boasts 20 sculptures, each a feast for the eyes – full of quirky ideas and colour created by a variety of artists. A must-see iconic stop that attracts thousands of visitors every year – have your camera ready!

The story goes...

While travelling Route 66 on a trip across the United States, the Pickles were drawn to an unusually popular attraction named "Cadillac Ranch", located in west Texas near Amarillo. Intrigued by the ranch's popularity, the "Utes in the Paddock" concept grew from a whimsical 'what if' seed... and in August 2007 the Utes team began working on the project.

Utes were donated by residents from the area, who caught the 'utes bug' after learning that many of Australia's most gifted outback artists were donating their time and talent to create this unique tribute to life in the bush.

Thousands of visitors have already been drawn by the quirky outdoor gallery to discover and share in the celebration of bush and outback life.

The gallery drives tourists into central west NSW from right across Australia and from overseas to experience firsthand the celebration of outback life.





SCULPTURE down the Lachlan

Nestled among nature, waiting to be discovered...

Sculpture Down the Lachlan is a permanent, inland public art trail stretching 100 kilometres from Condobolin all the way to Forbes, along the meandering Lachlan River.

This unique collection is more than an art experience – it's a journey through the soul of the landscape.

Over two dozen striking sculptures blend seamlessly with the raw, untamed beauty of the rural countryside. Each work tells a story, evoking moments of surprise, reflection, and awe!

Marvel at Heart of Country, Damian Vick's commanding sixmetre steel warrior. Experience the quiet strength of Clancy Warner's Between the Silence and the Heartbeat, a graceful blend of timber and bronze. Delve into the spiritual resonance of Greg John's Within – Without (of Land and Spirit), and let your imagination roam with David Ball's abstract creation, Wandering.





UNLYCK HISTORY and Heritage

For more than 200 years, the Lachlan region has been an agricultural heartland – with a proud history of sheep and cattle farming, grain crops (including wheat, oats and barley), plus mining for resources such as copper, gold and platinum.

Farming & Agriculture

Spend just a short while at Lake Cargelligo's outdoor displays of antique farm machinery and equipment (including steam engines!) and you'll get an understanding of how far back its history stretches. Of course, the giant silos dotting the landscape are also a nod to the importance of crops to this region.

But it wasn't always this way. For most of the 1800s, it was all about driving cattle and sheep stock, but the 1880s saw the first fruit and wheat cultivation – helping to grow Condobolin as a service town. By 1900, only 2700 acres of 1,000,000 was under wheat, but that would all change with the creation of dams and the arrival of the railway, as surrounding regions became part of the 'cereal belt' feeding a hungry nation.

In later years, crops have diversified to include canola and cotton – with Lachlan Shire being the centre of innovation in farming in dry conditions. The 1722ha Condobolin Agricultural Research and Advisory Station was founded in 1913 and today provides important insights on improving yields and soil fertility as well as combating weeds, diseases, frosts and drought. It also conducts dryland cropping research year round on wheat, barley, canola, field peas, lentils, chickpeas, lupins and pastures. The Research Station is available to visit by appointment on weekdays.



GROWING THE HEART OF NSW

John Oxley was the first European to survey the region, passing through in 1817. Twenty years later, Sir Thomas Mitchell founded the site of Condobolin as an important crossing on the Lachlan River. The town was established in 1859.

Large farms of sheep & wool, beef and wheat helped the area thrive, with discoveries of copper, platinum and gold in the late 1800s driving further growth to areas including Lake Cargelligo. The railway arrived in 1898.

Today, the Lachlan region is a diverse mix of farming (including livestock, grains and newer crops like canola and cotton), mining and manufacturing.

Mining

Like much of the world, the late 19th century saw a 'rush' of mining discoveries to the region. Gold was famously found accidentally by Mrs Foster in Lake Cargelligo in 1873 (you'll find a statue commemorating the very site) and it swiftly became a mining centre.


A major copper discovery was made north at Melrose in 1885 and then, at the end of 1894, gold fever broke out at the Overflow Station, immortalised in Banjo Paterson's poem 'Clancy of the Overflow'. From 1898-1910, a major copper and gold mine operated at Condobolin, and for a time, Fifield was Australia's largest platinum producer – with around 20,000 ounces (650kg) of alluvial platinum removed from the surrounding land.

Today, you can still see modern-day gold mining taking place at Lake Cowal near Burcher. It is New South Wales' largest inland lake and home to a 325m deep open pit gold mine project on its shores.

The area is currently experiencing growth in the mining sector.

Museums & Architecture

There are so many exciting ways to delve into the past – from exploring our fascinating museums to simply strolling through the vibrant streets! Lake Cargelligo Museum sits in a building that was the original dance hall at nearby Curlew. It contains an impressive array of machinery, tools, household items, clothing, bottles and memorabilia. Likewise, the Condobolin Museum boasts a diverse collection of artefacts and exhibits. The Burcher and Tottenham Historical Museums offer fascinating insights into the towns' vibrant pasts. They may be small in size, but they are big on history!



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History & Heritage



The area's past comes to life at the Lake Cargelligo Museum, set within the historic Curlew Hall which was relocated into town and established as a museum in 1971.


